

Anthony (Tony) Raymond Bauer, 68, a disabled Navy vet, who served in the Gulf of Tonkin invite Nam, did not believe that he would ever get the assistance that he desperately needed and if he did get that help, it would be a long time coming.

Little did he know that his plight had reached the ears of the Sun City Elks Veterans Committee.

Anthony is presently a resident in the Arizona State Veterans Home, and the home does notalways provide the equipment that some vets may need as it is not a federal facility.

Te=ony is permanently confined to either his bed or a wheel chair, a chair that he cannot manage himself, he needed a power chair.

The Sun City Elks work in close contact with many local veterans facilities and had recently heard that the Paralyzed Veterans facility had a brand new \$30,000 plus power chair that they could not use.

The Sun City Elks Veterans committee then checked with the Therapeutic director for the Veterans home to see if they would approve of the chair as their regulations require.
