On Friday, April 24, 2020, the Sun City Elks Veterans Committee, again provided a critical service to our area's Paralyzed Vets. Four (4) power wheel chairs by the Sun City Elks Lodge members, and from there the Elks Veterans committee loaded them up and delivered them to the Paralyzed Veterans Facility, in Phoenix, Arizona.

The Elks ever vigilant in protecting the proceeds of their Veterans budget, doubled up on their trip to downtown Phoenix, by delivering sleeping bags, blankets and homemade "plastic" mattresses to the homeless, at the C.A.S.S., in downtown Phoenix.

The plastic mattresses are hand made by the "Pueblo El Mirage Ladies Club", in the El Mirage R.V. facility in El Mirage, Arizona, the other items were donated by Elk members and friends.


