"Casas Adobes Elks #2663 Prepares Christmas Food Boxes for Donation"

On December 19th, lodge members assembled Christmas dinner boxes for 32 local families in need. More than 30 lodge members were directly involved in the project and more than \$5000 was spent in support of the families this year with the funds coming from the ENF Gratitude Grant (\$1500), AZ Elks Assn Social Welfare (\$250), lodge donation (\$250), and lodge member donations of cash and food items (\$1000+). Several lodge members donated all of the turkeys and one member donated all of the bread for each dinner box. All of the families received their dinner box on December 20th.

Each box was tailor made based upon the size of each family and contained a turkey, potato's, rice, pinto beans, salt, sugar, flour, tortillas, mac & cheese, green beans, corn, peas, diced tomato's, spaghetti, spaghetti sauce, cranberry sauce, stuffing, gravy mix, cookies, and bread. As a Christmas surprise, lodge members also provided 96 backpacks for the children of the families. The backpacks were also tailor made for each child and contained school supplies, goodies, and a age/gender appropriate gift. Throughout the year, lodge members donated the additional \$2797 in funds required to provide the backpacks.


"Sierra Vista Elks #2065 Donates Beacon Grant to Support Feast in a Bag"

Support the Elks National Foundation (ENF) by joining the Fidelity Club

As of December 8th, there are only **158** of the 26,222 (.006%) lodge members statewide that participate in the Fidelity Club. We need to do much better than that and joining the Fidelity Club is easily done at elks.org. Individual participation in the Fidelity Club has a direct and significant impact on a lodges' charitable activities.

Gratitude grants are awarded to a lodge that has met the Grand Exalted Rulers Per-Member donation goal the previous Elk year. ENF has added two \$500 bonuses to the Gratitude grant recognizing member donations on-line and participation in the Fidelity Club. A \$500 bonus if, 15% of lodge members donate a minimum of \$10.00 each elk year and an additional \$500 bonus for lodge's that have at least 15% of their members enrolled in the Fidelity Club.

The Fidelity Club is an automatic, regularly scheduled donation from a bank account or credit card, taken monthly (minimum \$5) or quarterly (minimum \$15) to ENF.
