Elks National Foundation News

As we begin the new Elk year, I'm pleased to report that your ENF committee has not changed from last year and I humbly thank the district chairs for their continued service. I believe that active participation with the ENF is a critical lynch pin for a successful lodge.

To say that the last Elk year was a challenge, is a massive understatement. However, our lodges found ways to support and participate in ENF programs regardless of the shutdown roadblocks we all encountered. My goals this year are for every lodge to; meet the incoming GER's per-member goal, have an increase in ENF grants, and increase member participation in the Fidelity Club.

We ended the year with state a per-member average of \$7.61, surpassing the GER's goal of \$4.80 per-member. Additionally, every district had per-member average that exceeded the GER per-member goal. Thirty four lodges exceeded the GER goal and sixteen lodges had a per-member increase from 2019-20.

Last year, 37 lodges in our state received 105 ENF grants that totaled **\$286,200**. This year, the ENF continues to give lodges broad latitude to use grant funds for direct donations to other organizations involved in COVID-19 relief. As with last year, the Promise grant will not be offered this year. On April 1st, applications opened for the Freedom and Gratitude grants and ENF will begin to accept applications for the Beacon and Spotlight grants on June 1st.

We started last year with **124** members in the Fidelity Club and ended the year with **187** members participating. That was a terrific increase that ranked us third in the nation, and we currently have **195** members in Fidelity Club, but I think we can do better. Let's see if we can get 300 or more members participating in Fidelity Club by the end of this year.
