

"Chandler Lodge #2429—Ten Years in Dictionary Program"

This year marks the 10th anniversary of instituting the dictionary project at the Chandler Elks lodge. The goal of this program is to assist all students in becoming good writers, active readers, creative thinkers, and resourceful learners by providing them with their own personal dictionary. The dictionaries are a gift to each student to use at school and at home for years to come. Educators see third grade as the dividing line between learning to read and reading to learn. The Chandler Elks distributed Spanish to English dictionaries to five Chandler Elementary Schools: Galveston, Hartford, San Marcos, Bologna and Shumway Elementary schools. The Chandler Elks purposefully selected these schools that are in need of actual books since the students are less likely to have tablets or computers at home. A total of 384 dictionaries were distributed this year. Bringing our total over the last 10 years to 3819.

Our Veterans Seminar at the AEA Mid-Year Convention was a huge success. Thank you to my District Chairs without whom this Seminar could not have been held. If you were unable to attend and have not yet receive your blue bag of information and a couple of craft kits don't worry. We will be contacting your Lodge Veterans Chair and making arrangements for delivery.

The Holiday season is fast approaching and now is the time to remember our Active-Duty Military and Veterans. Visit with a veteran in a VA Hospital or State Veteran Home. Drop off some Holiday goodies or buy a gift.

- For our Active Duty Service Members, hold a card drive at your Lodge and mail them to: <u>Operation Christmas Cards For Our</u> <u>Troops</u>. Beginning in early September, Operation Christmas Cards for Our Troops allows anyone who wishes to send cards to American service members to do so by submitting them by mail before December 5, 2022. You can send the Christmas cards to 714 Farmington Road West - Accokeek, Maryland 20607 as mentioned on USASOA's website. For security reasons, the USASOA requests that all cards are submitted without envelopes, bundled within a larger envelope or box labeled with a name and return address. Cards can range from store bought greeting cards with a handwritten positive message to handmade cards with holiday cheer for the soldiers. From there, USASOA staff and volunteers will then sort the cards and send them around the world to our deployed troops so that they reach them by Christmas Day. The USASOA stresses that letters mailed to them individually will not be mailed out and any cards meant for the troops must be bundled together without envelopes.
- Another option is: <u>Military Missions, Inc.</u> is a nonprofit organization whose purpose is to deliver care packages and thank-you letters to U.S. soldiers deployed around the world. Each care package contains between 10 and 15 thank-you cards or letters, making them one of the most critical and in-demand pieces of the package. While cards are accepted year-round (writers are encouraged not to date their letters as they'll be sent throughout the year), Holiday cards and letters are also accepted in the months of October, November and December. Military Missions reminds writers not to include envelopes or stamps and offers some tips for what to include in thank-you letters: words of encouragement, positive messages, informal talk about yourself and recent events. It is also suggested that writers avoid talking about politics or religion. Make sure your cards or letters for soldiers overseas do not contain glitter, as it can cause problems for the soldier receiving it. Letters should be addressed and mailed to Military Missions Inc., 3650 Boston Rd., Suite 138, Lexington, KY 40514, or dropped off there in person. To learn more about Military Missions, Inc.'s program, <u>check out their website</u>.

Short History of Veterans Day

World War I – known at the time as "The Great War" – officially ended when the Treaty of Versailles was signed on June 28, 1919, in the Palace of Versailles outside the town of Versailles, France. However, fighting ceased seven months earlier when an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, between the Allied nations and Germany went into effect on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. For that reason, November 11, 1918, is generally regarded as the end of "the war to end all wars."

Veterans Day continues to be observed on November 11, regardless of what day of the week on which it falls. The restoration of the observance of Veterans Day to November 11 not only preserves the historical significance of the date but helps focus attention on the important purpose of Veterans Day: A celebration to honor America's veterans for their patriotism, love of country, and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good.
