A Message from the Executive Director, Richard Ross PDDGER


Great to Be An Elk!

From Steele Research to Jack Wartner Youth Camp many other organizations are looking for change and see our program as an opportunity to succeed. Everyone who stopped by the Arizona Booth was amazed about what we did.

The information we provided to other Elks allows us to tell a story about our Research Center and a Youth Camp. How this research and finding is helping our children who graciously deserve a chance to live life to their fullest. Through all our hard work we shared to many, what out Doctors have done to find ways for our children to live long healthy live. I know that the Mortality rates have gone down with so many positive results, but I like to share two stories.

God Called this Young Lady but her research helped many!

Courtney Zillman's Story



Her cancer was in remission once, then she relapsed and needed a bone marrow transplant. A few months after that her cancer returned and pediatric oncologists at the Steele Center were out of treatment options.

Courtney died on Thanksgiving Day. She was 4 years old.

So, my NICU story would begin with Misael, Miguel and Mirea in 2010. It was UMC at the time. I gave birth to my first triplet at 22+6wks (Misael), he was tiny weighing 1lb 1 oz, and his lung collapsed, he only survived for the day.

8 days later at 24wks I gave birth to Mirea and Miguel. Mirea weighing 1lb 5oz and Miguel 1lb 11oz. They remind me how far we have come medically. 12 years ago, my little 24-week miracles were a rarity. Now working in the NICU a 24wker is a regular occurrence. These babies are met with confidence and care.

You hear a lot how baby girls seem to be stronger and do better than baby boys. That wasn't the case for me, my Mirea needed a lot of help and support. I held her twice before she was put on the High frequency oscillatory ventilation (HFOV). After that I was not able to hold her until she was just about ready to come home. I even got a call telling me to come in because she had coded several times, and it was possibly time to say goodbye. Lucky for me, I had amazing primary nurses and one of them repeatedly advocated for Mirea and eventually she received a PDA ligation. I honestly believe that is what saved her life.

Both Mirea and Miguel have Permanent Neonatal Diabetes Mellitus (NDM), it is a lifelong condition caused by a mutation in their KCNJ11 gene. Along with diabetes this mutation is also associated with developmental delay, epilepsy and other neurological conditions. My littles were treated in the NICU with glyburide.

Permanent Neonatal diabetes Mellitus (NDM) is a rare 1 in 300,000–400,000 newborns in 2016 and 1 in 500,000 in 1996.

Banner attendings (Dr Bader and Dr Kylathu) did research and have written a paper on the studies they did for NDM following the birth of the M&Ms. I can't open many as they require payment or some sort of log in, but here is a snippet of a paper that I was in fact able to access online.

Giving birth early and losing a child makes you feel alone and well, frankly like a failure. But the NICU nurses made me feel supported and heard. They loved and still love my kids as if they were their own. Even now, 12 years later someone will say something about my littles, and I will learn something new about their birth... Because they remember, they remember the delivery room, the emergency page, the crazy sugar babies in room 13.

NICU runs in Mirea's veins. Every year from kindergarten to 6th she has been a NICU nurse for career day. With help she made button headbands during the pandemic for mask wearing. She has donated parent goodie bags to the NICU with her Scholarship Pageant group (Cinderella). Did a book drive to help with the NICU library when it first started and now, she wants to help volunteering at clinic when the Kids of Steele are there.

Miguel still comes on his therapy days and has lunch with one of his primary nurses. He is always asking to come visit the nurses he grew up with and eat some Banner pizza lol.

For the first 5 years after they were born, I did not work outside of my home. When I was finally ready to work, I knew I didn't want to go back into finance. I was scared, I was scared to leave my kids, I was scared of starting over career wise, scared to fail. I wanted to make a difference for people and feel useful. I now had a lot of medical knowledge and experience from my kids. And I was fascinated by all the advancements that had taken place in the last 5 years alone. So I started school at Pima to be a medical assistant and I applied to work at the one place that gave me strength at my weakest moment.

I started off as a part time NICU HUC (health unit coordinator) at the front desk working 2 nights a week and then eventually added a day shift because I loved it. Even at HUC you learn so much. Everyone is always so willing to explain things when you ask. I joined many committees. Was laid off by Banner and crazy as it sounds, I came back lol. I started back at the NICU as a Formula Technician which is where I am now.

I now have 5 NICU graduates out of my 6 living children. I took home 30wk twin girls with NAS (Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome) and hip dysplasia in 2022 as medical kinship and adopted them in January 2024 and am fostering a 27weeker with several rare medical conditions including Holoprosencephaly and Hydrocephalus.

My oldest Markie is not a NICU graduate, but he spent 6 months of his early life visiting his siblings. He was 1.5 years and back then siblings could come in. He would sit in the recliner chair and eat snacks and color or read from books the NICU staff had given him.

Funding from Arizona Elks for Pediatric Medical Research is what makes all of this so important. Every second, every day new findings and research discoveries.



The Jack C. Warter Jr Youth Camp is Camp for Youth Groups such as the Boy and Girl Scouts, Cub Scouts, Brownies, 4-H, JROTC, CASA, Church Groups, and other not for profit. Youth Service Organizations are welcome to use the camp at no charge. We do, however, require a refundable \$350 Security (Which is Refunded at their request once the Camping Trip is completed) and a \$50 administration fee at the time of booking.

The Youth Summer Camp is owned and supported by The Arizona Elks Major Projects. We invest \$60,000 to \$70,000 each year to ensure it is ready for the youth of Arizona to come enjoy this unforgettable site. Therefore, we ask that our guests help keep the site in good condition. Located 40 miles Northeast of Globe, Arizona, Workman Creek is nestled in the Sierra Ancha Mountain Range. It's a remote mountain location so campers should be aware of bears, wolves, dangerous reptiles, flash flooding, and lightning.


