Jimm called the current Executive Director and then the hospital liaison to get her into the Pediatric Intensive Care Unit. His pin is a tracing of the initial picture taken the night she was admitted. Long story short, after rounds of chemo, the doctors diagnosed a second form of cancer, resulting in Emily dying July 2001. I know heart breaking. Jimm asked the Laaff family if he could use Emily's story to help raise money for Pediatric Cancer Research. So that is the background of his project. Now the plug - on March 22nd, Sergeant-at-Arms Shawnee Carlile is organizing a fundraiser being held at Tucson East Lodge 2532. If you are so inclined, her information is in the directory. Thank you for taking the time to think about this; as he says, one dollar is closer than before.

2024 The 3rd year of the Jewelry Project was outstanding! We had to make a call for more jewelry donations in September and your response was very nice! We have enough now for 2025 and possibly 2026 distributions!

We now have seven distribution sites:

The Steele Center Hospital including the Hematology and Oncology Labs Dobson Banner Hospital Elks Clinic Glendale/Thunderbird Banner Hospital Elks Clinic La Cholla Elks Clinic North Hills Elks Clinic Orange Grove Elks Clinic

In 2024 we held distributions for Valentine's Day, Mother's Day and Christmas. These are held for two to five days prior to the holiday at each clinic site. A HUGE thank you to the AEMP Board for the donation to assist our original waning budget as we began to run out of finding gold items to swap for money to support our boxes and supplies.

We served 1,158 children.

Volunteers: 43 Elk ladies, including a few neighbor friend of mine who helped to clean, box up, load crates, cut purses, punch holes in bags and cut ribbons for the bags, plus staffed the distribution sites.

Volunteer Hours: Were an amazing 117 hours.

Veterans StandDowns

StandDowns (SD) are typically one- to three-day events providing supplies and services to homeless Veterans, such as food, shelter, clothing, health screenings and VA Social Security benefits counseling. Veterans can also receive referrals to other assistance such as health care, housing solutions, employment, substance use treatment and mental health counseling. They are collaborative events, coordinated between local VA Medical Centers, the Department of Labor (DOL), other government agencies and community-based homeless service providers.

What is the Arizona Veterans StandDown Alliance (AVSA)

The Arizona Veterans StandDown Alliance, established in 2013, is a program of the Arizona Housing Coalition that holds annual events and resource fairs in 13 of Arizona's 15 counties, including the nation's largest event of its kind, the annual Maricopa County StandDown. These events allow veterans and their families who are experiencing housing instability and homelessness to get and stay connected to housing and supportive services.





To All Local Lodges and Members of the Grand Lodge of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the United States of America.

GREETINGS:

The Grand Exalted Ruler, by and with the approval of the Board of Grand Trustees of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the United States of America, acting upon authority given him under Article 3, Section 6, Grand Lodge Constitution, does hereby proclaim that the next session of the membership of the Grand Lodge of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will convene in Kansas City, Missouri with the opening ceremonies and meetings held at the Kansas City Convention Center, 301 West 13th Street, Kansas City, MO 64105 on Sunday, June 29, 2025, at 4:00 p.m. The opening business session will convene in the Kansas City Convention Center at 8:00 Monday morning, June 30, 2025, at which session the election of Officers for the ensuing year will be held.
